This is another support mechanism for clients in the Kivalliq who require childcare while training to reach their career goals.

FNIYES (First Nations/Inuit Youth Employment Strategy) Funding

- *Under the AANDC (Aboriginal Affairs & Northern Development Canada) programming agreement, we are provided with 2 funds for programming.
- *The first program is targeted towards employment/work experience for students returning to school. These funds are distributed to employers who hire students to gain work experience during summer breaks.
- *The second program is targeted towards Career Promotion and science programs. Funds are used for regional science fairs, annual science camps and career fairs.
